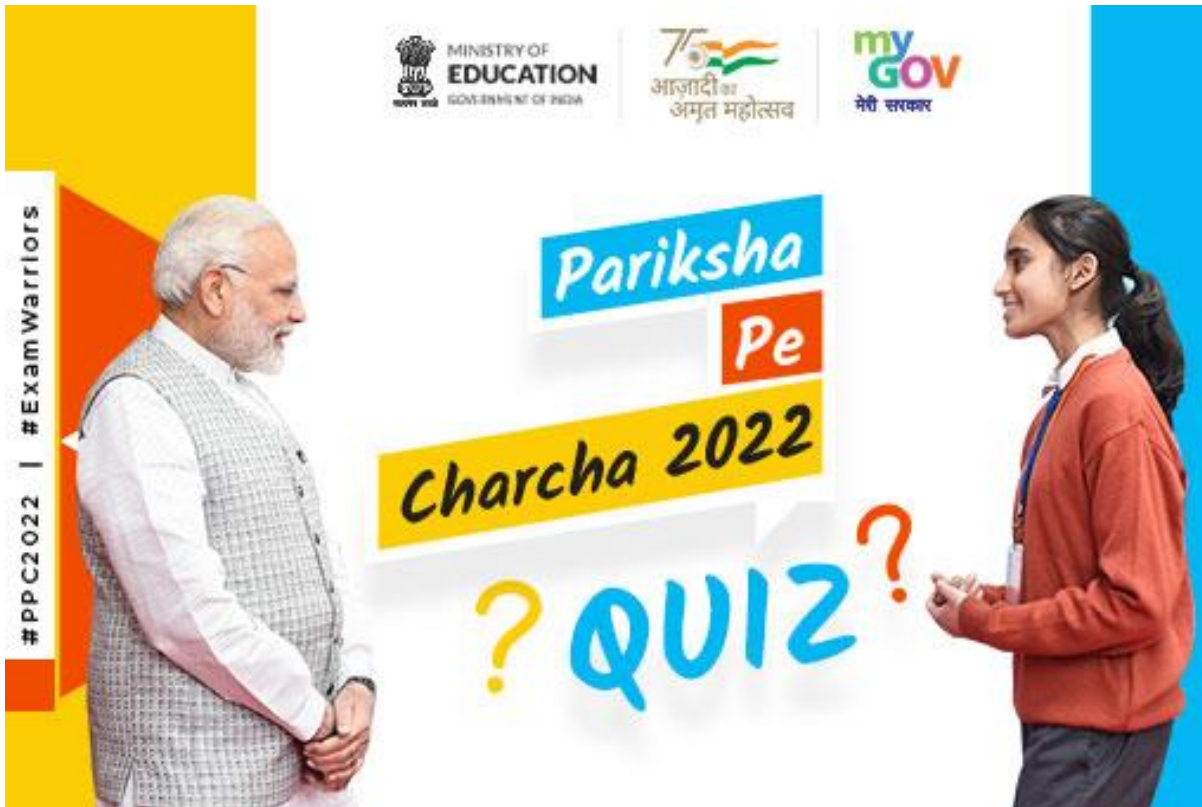
Report: Pariksha Pe Charcha – An Online Event

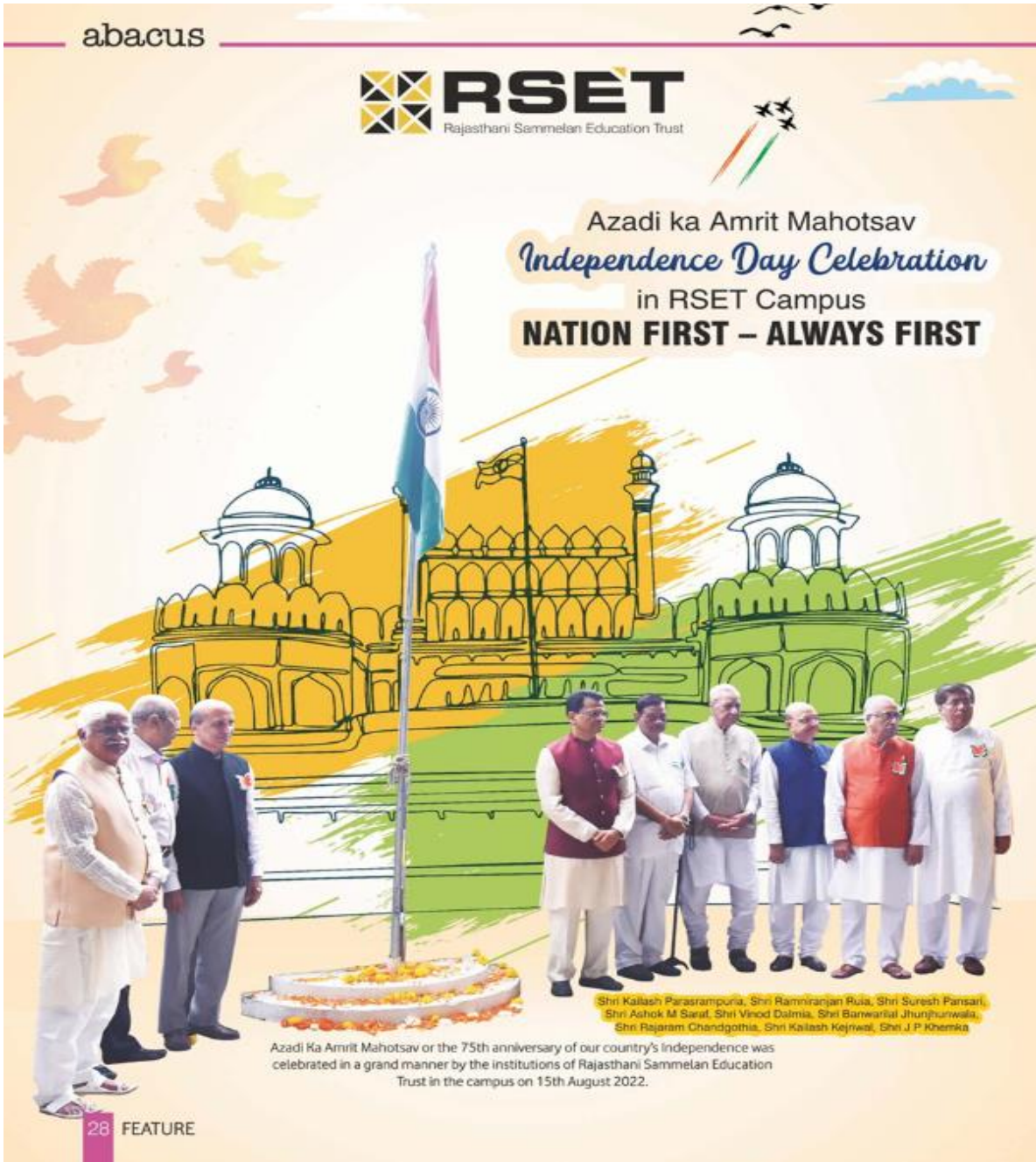

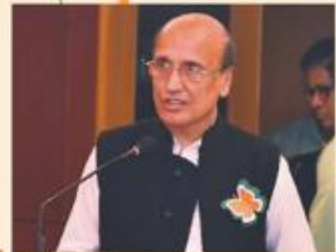
