



One-sided love, a bittersweet curse, A flame that burns, but can't reverse. Yet still, I'll cherish this unrequited art, For loving you has its own quiet part.






STREET SAVIORS: HERO FOR HOMELESS HOUNDS


Corporate Career to Canine Crusader

3 minors among 11 dead after inhaling toxic gas in Giaspura area of Ludhiana







Thackeray said that on May 6 he will visit Barsu village in coastal Ratnagiri district where residents are protesting a proposed oil refinery. "This is not PoK (Pakistan occupied Kashmir) or Bhangladesh where I cannot go. Nobody can stop me," he said.

Coming down heavily on Shinde, Uddhav said that the former has no say in administrative matters and has no op tion but to take orders (from BJP). "The land at BKC was given to bu llet train. Who is going to use it? Did you get khokas (boxes of mo-ney) for that," he asked Shinde. Leader of the Opposition and Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) lcader Ajit Pawar who attended the rally said that the present state government is not

of peoples' wish. "This government has come to power through gad-dari (backstabbing)," said Pawar.

Slamming the gover-nment over its func-tioning as well as lack of financial discipline, Pawar alleged the cen-tralisation of adminis-tration across local bodies as no elections are being held.

"This government is scared of elections. Why is it not announcing lo-cal body elections? They are scared of the people of Maharashtra," he said. Clarifying that the MVA would stand together in the upcoming elections, Pawar appea-led to the workers of all three parties to remember that winnability will be the only criteria and those who will not get ticket should also not get dishcartened.

"People write without cross-checking evi-dence. I want people to not get misguided by such news," Pawar said, without directly referring to the recent speculations about him about joining hands with the BJP. Claiming that the present state that the present state government has only a few days left, Shiv Sena (UBT) MLA Aaditya Thackeray said, "It is coming down for sure. It is just a matter of few days now."

Adding that people ga-thered in the BKC not for language, religion or caste, Aaditya said, "We are here as Constitution protectors," he said.

Campus Talk: SVU launches digital museum on collection of manuscripts, paintings, sculpture

A historic object reveals as many facets as questions posed of it. Taking a cue from this. the Somaiya Vidyavi-har University (SVU) is changing the way re-ligious and ancient Indian history is taught in its classes by bringing those historic objects into the classrooms.

The SVU has laun ched a digital museum, which is a collection of manuscripts, paintings, sculpture and other artefacts from ancient India. The collection includes manuscripts, sculptures and paintings that are symbolic representations of the Vaishnav cult or paintings depicting themes or compositions from Gita, Ramayana, Maha-bharata, Vedas among all. The collection has been developed for over 80 years, originally started by K J Somaiya, founder of the Somaiya trust. This accessible repository of rare texts and paintings from ancient Indian history as changed the of functioning of the K J Somaiya Institute of Dharma Studies at the SVU, said an official of the university

Director of Dharma Studies, Dr Supriya Rai, said, "Our effort is gea-red towards facilitating an engagement with the objects in our collec-tion in wars that tion in ways that equips students with research skills and fosters an enduring appreciation of culture and heritage." For example, students attending workshops on ancient scripts offered by the Dharma Studies would have to visit the cave complex at Kanhe ri in Sanjay Gandhi Na-tional Park; which is a rich resource of inscriptions in Brahmi. "Now. with these manuscript collections, we have added an in-house resource for students to learn and practice these his toric scripts," said Rai.

She added, "The digital collection has five di-fferent manuscripts of the Kalpasutra, a very famous Jain text. This text has been studied and written about extensively, as a tradi-tion and by academi-cians. But at the SVU, students study these manuscripts, compare their illustrations and note the variations, study the annotations, note the contents of the colophon (which gives important information about that par-ticular witness) and do everything hands-on — which adds an invaluable dimension to a student's learning ex-perience." Chancellor of the SVU, Samir Somai-ya, said, "We are working on creative ways to enrich our students' lives. The launch of the digital manuscript co-llection is a huge step in this direction." The private university is also extending this access to others from the field of religious studies, stu-dents of ancient Indian History, culture and archaeology for academic

In 2001, we visited wage earners in villages around IsAH Gaya in Bhar who had emerged voctorious over a mights Math in the 1080s. The land had shifted to the liters after a long struggle led by Javaprakash Narayan's Sangharsh Vahmi. Talking to women 20 overs later, we realised that the land that was given to the men as the "hoad of the household" as per government policy, was already sold off, drunk off, or bartered off. However, in the later phase of the movement, their uninister Lallo Prasad Yada listened to the women activists and registered the land in the name of women tillers.

The outcome was remarkable. Women held onto their land, amidst impossible poverty and planned to pass it down to their daughters and daughters sin-law. "Men drink, women keep," they remarked. We asked these women why they had but children each. They answered that contraction is very difficult to obtain. You have to take a bus to the taluka place, wait at the government chinc or dispensary for the whole day, listen to their curses and get a few condoms or pills. Doing this every few days is impossible, as we lose wages and money." It wasn't that they wanted more children, they just did not have many options. Policy makers and the urban upper classes think that the poor meed to be made. "aware". They need to be made "aware". They need to be made "aware" and contraception. against their reluctation, superstition, finances, and contraception. — against their reluctation to accept development. Hence, while making new


policies and passing legislation, the masses are never consulted. Obviously, many new, well-meaning policies fail.

When R D Karve advocated bir-th control and family planning in 1921 in Mumbai, it was for women to experience their full po-tential as human beings by being part of an active work force and to enjoy sensual pleasures without the endless eyele of preenancy the endless cycle of pregnancy and delivery. Do we think women don't know this? That they like to go through the exeruciating pain of childbirth and the debilitating physical condition again and again? Why do they do it? In Maharashtra, while working in Osmanabad district, I saw government sterilisation camps routi-nely conducting the complicated and risky female tubectomy. This is a major surgery with general anaesthesia and requires one month of rest and care. In India. 36 per cent of family planning is done through this method as opposed to 0.3 per cent vasectomy. Vascetomy is so fast and painless that the man can walk home the same day. Logically, this method should be a prefe method of contraception But, that's not the case

India has managed to curtail the risk of women dying in childhurth or related complications in recent years. Cruelty and labour within the family break their spirit, yet they celebrate festheir spirit, yet they celebrate tes-tivals with the same family with exuberance. While successive go-vernments keep them away from education and health, they vote in every election and run village panchayats. Women in India are a wonder. Starting this Women's Day, policy makers would do better by listening to them
