AV FOR CONGENITAL HEART DISEASE




The Rotaract Club of Deviprasad Goenka Management College of Media Studies (RCDGMC) and its Parent Rotary, The Rotary Club of Bombay Airport (RCBA), collaborated on a two-day video shoot project to raise public awareness about congenital heart disease (CHD). The project took place on 7th and 8th March 2023, with the primary objective of educating the public about CHD and highlighting the RCBA initiative's role in supporting affected children.

The challenge at hand was to create an impactful audiovisual (AV) resource that effectively conveyed the significance of early diagnosis and treatment for CHD. The project required meticulous planning, coordination, and execution to ensure a successful outcome. Additionally, the students of DGMC sought to gain practical experience and hands-on exposure to a large-scale shoot.





During the pre-production planning phase, the students of DGMC actively participated, contributing their ideas and creativity to the project. This involvement allowed them to apply their theoretical knowledge and develop project management and communication skills.

The two-day shoot commenced at Deviprasad Management College of Studies, where the initial segment of the video narrative was captured. The second day of filming took place at Shri Satya Sai Sanjeevani Hospital in Kharghar, Mumbai. This provided the students with exposure to different shooting locations and environments, allowing them to adapt to the challenges and logistics of a multi-location shoot. The experience broadened their understanding of the production process. The students had the opportunity to witness and learn from experienced Rotarians, including Past President Rtn. Nitin Mehta and President-Elect Rtn. Apurva Patel. The central goal of the project was to create a powerful audiovisual resource that would effectively (AV) communicate the critical importance of early diagnosis and treatment for CHD.

After the filming phase, the footage from both days underwent meticulous editing to create a cohesive and impactful video resource. The video is set to be launched in the forthcoming Installation ceremony of RCBA's R.I. Year 2024-25.

The hands-on exposure to a large-scale shoot provided them with invaluable practical experience.






