EARTH DAY EVERYDAY

To mark Earth Day, the Rotaract Club of DGMC organized a unique event, "Every Day Earth Day," blending physical activity with environmental consciousness. The event was divided into two parts. ROTARY INTERNATIONAL YEAR 2021-22

FLOOD RELIEF DONATION DRIVE

The donation drive, organised by RCDGMC in collaboration with the Khushiyan Foundation, commenced on 30th July 2021 and concluded on 6th August 2021. On 16th September 2021, the volunteers undertook the distribution process in Hatnoli Wadi, Karjat. Residents convened at Samaj Mandir, where hygiene kits comprising antiseptic, soap, sanitary napkins, toothbrushes, toothpaste, Soframycin, masks, and cleaning cloths were distributed.



Blankets were also provided to households with elderly members. A similar distribution process was conducted in another part of the village. Additionally, clothing was distributed to men, women, and children, while each family received 1kg of rice and packets of masoor dal. Volunteers provided instructions on the appropriate use of the products and emphasised the importance of hygiene practices. The interaction between the residents and volunteers fostered a sense of community and goodwill. This initiative, facilitated with the support of the Mohar and Khushiyan Foundation, addressed the immediate needs of the local population during a challenging period.



It also underscored the importance of utilising resources to create a positive impact. The gratitude and joy expressed by the residents served as a testament to the drive's success and reaffirmed the value of dedicated community service.

BECOMING TRIBAL LITERATE

On 9th August 2021, to mark the International Day of the World's Indigenous Peoples, the project Becoming Tribal Literate was inaugurated. Through research led by Principal Dr. Amee Vora and Club Advisor Prof. Selvi S., we identified Damkhind, a village in Palghar, as a community in need of support. On 19th August, World Humanitarian Day, a team from RCDGMC set out to conduct an in-depth study of the village.

Throughout the day, members engaged with local residents to understand their lifestyle. They conducted season mapping to analyze cropping patterns, yield, and incomes. To learn about the village's history, Rtr. Sakshi Kesarkar interviewed elder residents. Problem tree analysis was used to identify key issues, their causes, and effects to develop effective solutions.



This project thrived on direct interaction, fostering deep connections with the villagers. Listening to their stories, sharing experiences, and immersing in their traditional ways helped us gain valuable insights. By working alongside them, we aimed to find sustainable solutions rooted in their culture and knowledge.

The interaction between the volunteers and residents added warmth to the endeavour, making the experience deeply fulfilling. The smiles and gratitude of the villagers were a testament to the success of the drive, highlighting the importance of community service and meaningful impact.

TWINKLE IN THE WRINKLE

On 16th November 2021, the Rotaract Club of DGMC visited Shri Nityanand Ashram in Masacha Pada, Kashi Gaon. The President, Rtr, represented the Club. Chetna Shastri, the Secretary, Rtr. 




ROTARY INTERNATIONAL YEAR 2022-23

PROUD GIRL

MINDFUL MILES

The sessions featured elements of meditation, mindfulness exercises, and relaxation techniques. The focus was on equipping drivers with strategies that could be easily incorporated into their daily routines, both during work hours and in their personal lives. Techniques taught included deep breathing exercises, guided imagery, progressive muscle relaxation, and mindfulness practices to promote present-moment awareness and reduce stressful events. Feedback from BEST drivers indicated that the sessions were well received. Drivers reported enjoying the program and found the techniques and strategies learned to be highly useful in managing their stress levels. Given the positive response and the recognized need for such initiatives, the Rotaract Club of DGMC intends to conduct similar sessions in the future.















ROTARY INTERNATIONAL YEAR 2021-22

Mr. Galloway also highlighted his role in advocating for the criminalisation of conversion therapy, even representing the cause at the state Senate at the age of 20. The session included a Q&A segment where Mr. Galloway answered several questions from the audience. The webinar concluded with Rtr. Nishant Dongre delivered the vote of thanks, bringing the event to a successful close.

MODEL UNITED NATIONS
















ROTARY INTERNATIONAL YEAR 2020-21

SOUL SYNC


Strengthening family bonds and promoting mental well-being took centre stage on January 13 2024, at the transformative event "Soul Sync."

PORTFOLIO MAKING WORKSHOP






ROTARY INTERNATIONAL YEAR 2021-22


GET FIT



HEALTH AND WELLNESS EXPO


















ROTARY INTERNATIONAL YEAR 2021-22



NEW YEAR - NEW THOUGHTS



DESH KA DIGITAL POSTER




SECRET SANTA 2.0

AV FOR CONGENITAL HEART DISEASE
